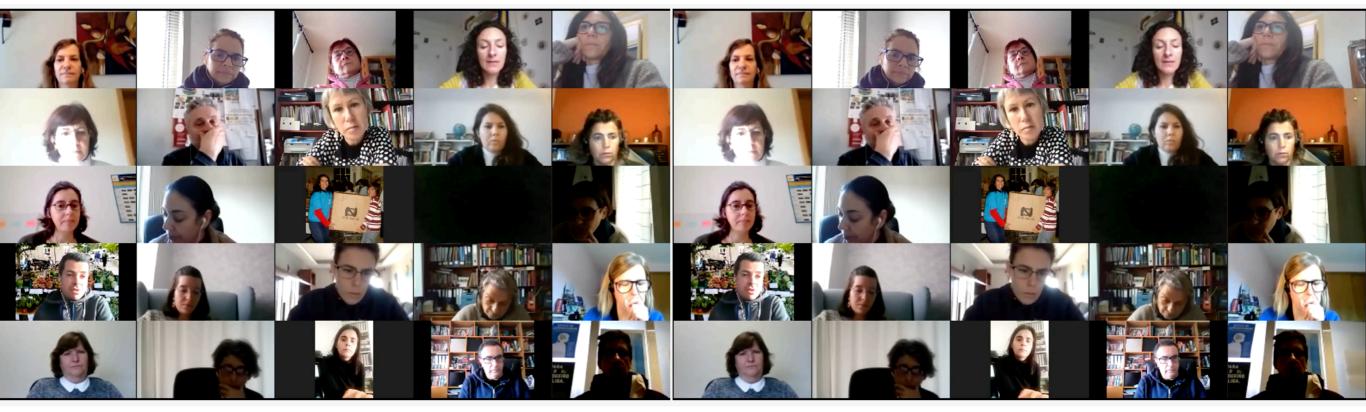

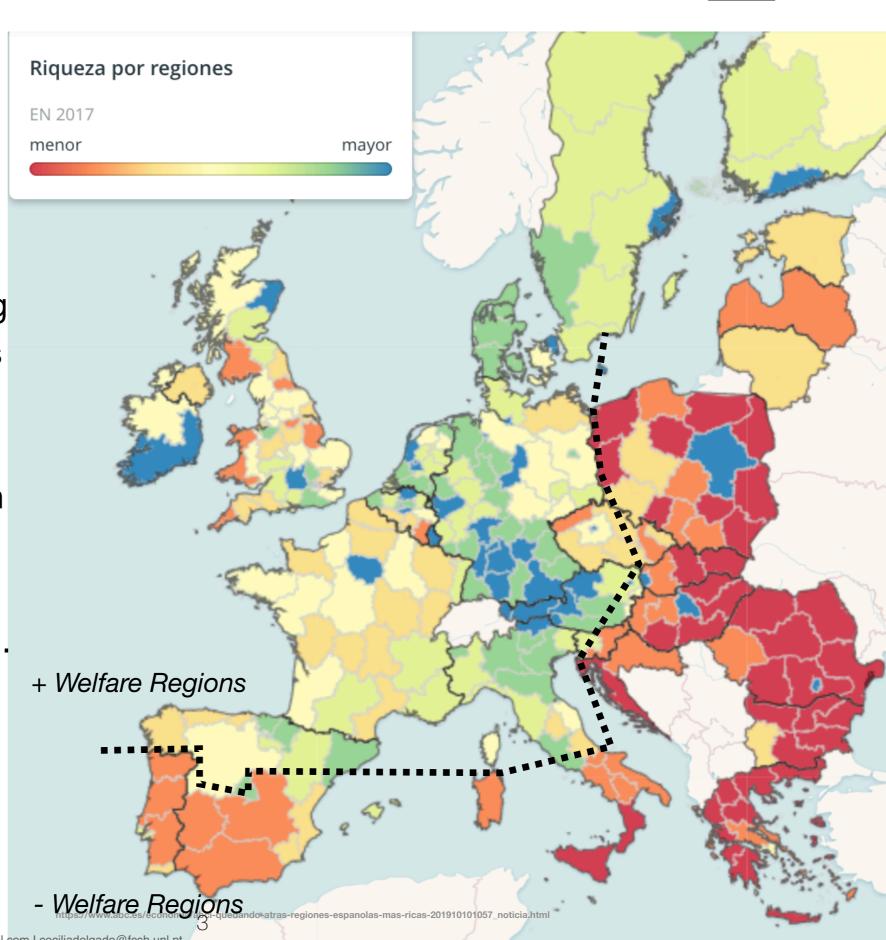


Why sharing information on food is relevant?

Peer to Peer learning for food democracy?

- 1. It is a central concept for food democracy. It involves 'democratic communication on the same level, non-hierarchical and antiauthoritarian creation rather than reaction.
- 2. Share knowledge. The idea is to broaden the understanding of the diversity of sectors and actors, across the food system.
- 3. Try to build collective knowledge and a comunity of practice, as a tool to improve individual and collective decisions and hopefully better public policies
- 4. Almost all information is shared in Portuguese. The Language challenge was quite relevant as it allowed to bridge the gap between, remarkably the academia and other food actors
